How to play

To play the game, you and your opponent slot your counters into the game board alternately. The winner is the first to line up 4 of their counters in a row, either vertically, horizontally or diagonally.

There are two ways to place your counter:

1) Tap the column you wish to drop your counter into.

or

2) Hold your thumb or finger on the screen and drag your turn indicator arrow (above game board) above the column you wish to drop your counter into. Then let go and the counter drops.

Options

One player: Play against the iPhone/iPod Touch

Two players: Play against a friend

Counter select: Tap counters next to player names to toggle player counter colour

Player name entry: Tap name field to enter player one and player two names

Level select: In one player mode select levels 1-7 by tapping the relevant level select button. Level 1 is very easy, level 7 is a challenge to say the least.

Select start counter: Select to start every game with the red counter, blue counter or choose to alternate.

Note:

Example: Player one has selected to play with blue, and blue counter is selected to start the game. Player one then decides to change and play with red. Start counter will automatically also change to red so player one still starts the game.

Drop row when full: Turn this option on to add an extra dimension to game play. Now, every time the bottom row of the game board is filled it will drop away and disappear.

Imagine your opponent is close to a winning line and one or more of the potential winning line counters are on the bottom row. You can scupper their chances by filling this row and eliminating the threat. It really adds to the competitiveness of this game and takes the basic concept of this classic game to a whole new level.

Timer: Turn this option on if you want to make the game even more competitive. For example, set the timer to 3 seconds. Now every time it's your move you have 3 seconds to make it. If you don't the iPhone/iPod Touch will make a random move for you. It could be a lucky random move or one that really puts you in trouble. Of course if you're playing in two player mode then your opponent also has to move within the time restriction which is great fun as you're having to pass the iPhone/iPod Touch to each other between go's.
